Directed by Sönke Wortmann. Released 2003. Set in post-war Germany, following the story of a family and the German nation on its journey to the 1954 World Cup.

Das Boot (The Boat).

Directed by Wolfgang Peterson. Released 1981. A German submarine crew fights the Allies in 1941.

Lola Rennt (Run Lola Run)

Directed by Tom Tykwer. Released 1998. Energetic and fast paced – a young woman needs to get 100,000 DMs or her boyfriend will die. Fantastic performance by Franka Potente (she was in The Bourne Identity).

Goodbye Lenin!

Directed by Wolfgang Becker. Released 2003. A heart-warming comedy set in East Germany about a young man (played by Daniel Brühl) whose socialist mother awakes from a coma, unaware of the recent German reunification.

Das Leben der Anderen (The Lives of Others)

Directed by Florian Henckel von Donnersmarck. Released 2007. Set in 1980s East Berlin, a Stasi Officer (East German Police) becomes embroiled in the lives of others he has under surveillance.
