Teach Maidenhead is the foremost teacher training provider west of London, providing tuition-fee secondary School Direct places in a wide range of subjects. Founded in 2013, the partnership offers a unique school-based learning opportunity in conjunction with the University of Reading where intensive subject-based training is delivered. Trainees gain QTS (Qualified Teacher Status) and PGCE (Postgraduate Certificate in Education) as well as 60 credits towards a Master's Degree.













School Direct Tuition Fee Trainees

This route is suitable for all those who have a degree in a relevant subject, or who are in their final year of undergraduate study. Trainees undertake rigorous subject based tuition at the University of Reading, plus two training placements at Teach Maidenhead schools. where trainees initially observe lessons, before beginning their own teaching practice. During their placements trainees also attend weekly professional studies sessions, led by experts from across the Teach Maidenhead schools. Trainees are assessed via university-based assessments and observed lessons.

Costs for 2023-2024 Training

Trainees can apply for a loan to cover the cost of teacher training which is currently £9,250. This means you do not have to pay course fees upfront.

Trainees can also apply for a maintenance loan of up to £12,667.

Both are available even if you already have a student loan, and regardless of whether you receive a bursary or scholarship.

Loan repayments only commence once you are earning.



Support We Can Offer You During The Application Process

- An up to date website providing all the information you need to ensure you are well informed about the partnership; subjects for which we offer training; information about fees and funding; how to apply for training opportunities and eligibility criteria.
- School experience initially consisting of one day, with additional school experience available to those applicants whose potential for training to teach comes through on their UCAS application.
- The opportunity to visit, tour, meet the subject department and be interviewed at the school you will be assigned for your main placement.
- Confirmation of where your main placement will be when you are made an offer.
- The chance to re-visit your main placement school after an offer has been made.
- Opportunities to attend SKE (Subject Knowledge Enhancement) courses prior to starting the teacher training courses if required and if you are eligible.
- An invitation to a trainee welcome day in July to meet the other trainees, a representative from Reading University and mentors from the partnership schools.



The Teach Maidenhead Partnership


Our partnership consists of five secondary schools: Furze Platt Senior School (founder lead school), and Cox Green School. Altwood Church of England School, Desborough College and Holyport College. We are also linked to a number of primary schools. All Teach Maidenhead secondary schools teach students from ages 11-18 and have well established Sixth Forms.

We are proud of the diversity of our schools which give trainee teachers the opportunity to teach the entire secondary age range in schools which include coeducational, single-sex, nondenominational, a church school and a free school. The partnership also includes a service which supports children in mainstream educational settings with a Autistic diaanosis of Spectrum Disorder (ASD).



Where to Find Us

Maidenhead is located halfway between London and Reading, one mile from the M4 and six miles from the M40. The five main Teach Maidenhead schools are located in the four corners of the town, a little over a mile away from each other. Maidenhead benefits from excellent rail and road connections. which improved further by the completion of Crossrail. The town is 15 minutes from Reading University by train and 20 minutes from London on a non-stop train. Heathrow Airport is approximately ten miles to the east. Windsor, Henley and Marlow are all within ten miles and Oxford is approximately 35 miles away.

Applicants Must Have:

- A GCSE, or comparable qualification, at grade 4 (C) or above in English Language and Mathematics.
- A first or second-class UK Bachelor's degree in an appropriate subject, or an overseas qualification of an equivalent standard from a recognised higher education institution. The equivalence of all overseas degrees must be verified through NARIC.

Successful applicants will be offered a training place at a confirmed main placement school.

School Experience Days

Our school experience days provide an opportunity to visit one of our five schools and see the school in action. They start with an introduction to Teach Maidenhead, how we operate and how we support trainees who join our consortium. This is followed by a short tour of the school and the opportunity to observe three lessons. Finally, visitors are invited to share their experiences with a senior leadership team member. Further school experience opportunities will be available to any applicants being called for an interview.
