As we are approaching our final two weeks of term, it is time to check in with the goals you set yourself on day one of year 12. Have you managed to stick to those goals? Do you need to reflect on any bad habits that are starting to form in your approach to your studies? As tiredness kicks in and the honeymoon phase is over, it is very easy to forget what you promised yourself at the start 5 weeks ago. Therefore, this week we will be revising some of that best practice. Below is a reminder of the checklist from the start of term, try and identify what you have done and what you may have stopped doing!

- 1. Organised a folder with dividers
- 2. Put a list of the assessment objectives/course requirements in your folder
- 3. Spent an additional 4-5 hours a week of independent study on each subject Consistently taken notes in lessons
- 4. Experimented with different ways of recording information/ note taking
- 5. Reviewed your notes after each lesson (if you haven't yet then get into the habit) Conducted additional research for your subject before lessons to aid your understanding
- 6. If you have struggled with a new concept, have you asked your teacher for help or advice
- 7. Contributed to a class discussions
- 8. Created a weekly study schedule to aid time management
- 9. Organised a space at home to study effectively and store schoolwork
- 10. Reflected on how you use your time across the school week
- 11. Identified distractions and thought about how to remove them


We continue to focus on UCAS and study skills. If you are feeling overwhelmed by either of these things then please do book in a meeting with me – I'm here to help!

- Being organised is one of the simplest things you can do to achieve Level 3 success
- Having a daily to do list helps you to focus on what you have to each day
- Here are some things you might need to think about when compiling your list

DAILY TO DO LIST - WHICH ONES WILL YOU COVER TODAY?

- 1. What lessons are coming up and what content do I need to read ahead ready for the lesson?
- Does my folder need organising?
- 3. What homework do I need to complete?
- 4. Are there topics that need summarising with summary sheets, flashcards?
- 5. Are there topics that I need to test if I can recall the information?
- 6. Have I created my own exam questions on the content?
- 7. Have I checked my notes against the Mark Schemes and Examiner Reports?
- 8. Have I tried checking if my notes answer lots of different types of exam questions?
- 9. Have I identified the topics I find hardest to understand and tried to help myself to understand it? Seek help?
- 10. Do I need to cover some previous content to make sure I keep recalling it ready for the exam





2024 ENTRY KEY DATES

| 2 May 2023 | UCAS' search tool displays 2024 courses. |
|------------------------------------|--|
| 9 May 2023 | The adviser portal opens for 2024 entry. From this date, you can set up your adviser portal ready for your students to link to your centre. |
| 16 May 2023 | Undergraduate applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can start their applications and send them to you for references and approval. |
| 12 July 2023 | Conservatoire applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can register, pay, and send their applications. |
| 5 September 2023 | Completed undergraduate applications can be submitted to UCAS. |
| 2 October 2023 18:00 (UK time) | Application deadline for conservatoire music applications. Applications for dance, drama, and musical theatre courses may have a different deadline – check conservatoires' websites for information. |
| 16 October 2023 18:00 (UK time) | Deadline for applications to the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and for most courses in medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine/science. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us. |
| 31 January 2024 18:00 (UK time) | Equal consideration date for applications for most undergraduate courses. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us. Deadline for most conservatoire undergraduate dance, drama or musical theatre courses. Check on the specific course to be sure. |
| 28 February 2024 | Extra opens – applicants who have used all five choices and are not holding any offers may be able to add another choice in their application. |
