The Early Entry deadline for UCAS is now a month away (13th October – the final day we can send these off) and students who are applying for this have been sent some information from me on the process. Parents of aspiring medics should check out the webinar by InvestIn education (see page 8).

All students should have completed a first draft of their personal statement by now and have uploaded this to Unifrog. There is an upcoming webinar provided by the University of Portsmouth on 26th September - https://tinyurl.com/5xxfd5wa - that will explore how to write excellent statements. Please encourage your child to register and watch this session.

Students that are interested in degree apprenticeships or the apprenticeship route should also be writing personal statements and developing their CVs. As I mentioned in the Prepare to Succeed evening, there is no fixed application cycle for these roles and so apprenticeships will become live when employers want. By having statements and CVs ready, they can be adapted quickly to the post if it is of interest.

Top Tips

- Identify things in your life that are important to you, such as sport or part time work and set a schedule of when you will fit school work in around them Get the Balance Right
- Don't set any goal other than time allocation, set the habit of routine
- Work with plenty of breaks as described in the Pomodoro technique
- Use study time and TSS in school wisely this leaves more time at home for other things; learning to drive, job, sport, socialising
- Based on research, it is shown that the amount of additional focused study outside of lessons per week equates to grades achieved;




UCAS deadlines for the 2024 cycle



2024 ENTRY KEY DATES

2 May 2023	UCAS' search tool displays 2024 courses.
9 May 2023	The adviser portal opens for 2024 entry. From this date, you can set up your adviser portal ready for your students to link to your centre.
16 May 2023	Undergraduate applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can start their applications and send them to you for references and approval.
12 July 2023	Conservatoire applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can register, pay, and send their applications.
5 September 2023	Completed undergraduate applications can be submitted to UCAS.
2 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Application deadline for conservatoire music applications. Applications for dance, drama, and musical theatre courses may have a different deadline – check conservatoires' websites for information.
16 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Deadline for applications to the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and for most courses in medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine/science. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us.
31 January 2024 18:00 (UK time)	Equal consideration date for applications for most undergraduate courses. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us. Deadline for most conservatoire undergraduate dance, drama or musical theatre courses. Check on the specific course to be sure.
28 February 2024	Extra opens – applicants who have used all five choices and are not holding any offers may be able to add another choice in their application.
