#### UCAS:

There are **four weeks** before the school's internal UCAS deadline. This deadline has been set to ensure that we can review each students' application before sending it off to UCAS by the January deadline. These meetings take at least 30 minutes each and so it is essential that you are doubling your efforts on completing these over the course of the next few weeks. Please update your statements on Unifrog and let your tutors know so that they can provide you with timely feedback!

#### Early Entry:

Students have been contacted about the **school's Early Entry deadline (6<sup>th</sup> October).** This is to ensure that we can book meetings with each candidate and have their application sent off before Friday 13<sup>th</sup> October (the final school day for sending off applications).

#### Managing workload:

Students around the Sixth Form will be beginning to feel the pinch (if they haven't already!) with regards to expectations for study in Year 13. It can often feel quite overwhelming and so I'd encourage the following tips to help keep on top of things:

- Identify where you have time (you'll realise that you have more than you thought!)
- Break down the big projects into short and meaningful tasks.

## The Study Room



#### The Benefits of Pre-reading

This week your Tutor study session was on the benefits of prereading and you used the **SQ3R method** to analyse a piece of text. Here is a reminder;

The 4 steps are: Survey – Question – Read – Recite – Review

#### Step 1 Survey

- The title, headings, and subheadings
- Captions under pictures, charts, graphs or maps
- Review questions or teacher-made study guides
- Introductory and concluding paragraphs
- Summary

#### **Step 2 Question**

- Turn the title, headings, and/or subheadings into questions
- Read questions at the end of the chapters or after each subheading
- Ask yourself "What did my teacher say about this chapter or subject when it was assigned?"
- Ask yourself "What do I already know about this subject?" If it is helpful to you, write out these questions for consideration

#### Step 3 Read Slowly

- Look for answers to the questions you first raised (read with purpose!)
- Reread captions under pictures, graphs, etc. to help you understand the content of the resource.
- Note all the underlined, italicized, bold printed words or phrases what is the significance of these?
- Slow you reading down or reread sections that are not clear.
- Read only a section at a time and recite after each section

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#### Step 4 Recite/Review

- Orally ask yourself questions about what you have just read, or summarise, in your own words, what you read
- Take notes from the text but write the information in your own words
- Underline or highlight important points you've just read Reciting. The more senses you use the more likely you are to remember what you read



## **2024 ENTRY KEY DATES**

2 May 2023	UCAS' search tool displays 2024 courses.
9 May 2023	The adviser portal opens for 2024 entry. From this date, you can set up your adviser portal ready for your students to link to your centre.
16 May 2023	Undergraduate applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can start their applications and send them to you for references and approval.
12 July 2023	Conservatoire applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can register, pay, and send their applications.
5 September 2023	Completed undergraduate applications can be submitted to UCAS.
2 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Application deadline for conservatoire music applications. Applications for dance, drama, and musical theatre courses may have a different deadline – check conservatoires' websites for information.
16 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Deadline for applications to the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and for most courses in medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine / science. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us.
31 January 2024 18:00 (UK time)	Equal consideration date for applications for most undergraduate courses. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us. Deadline for most conservatoire undergraduate dance, drama or musical theatre courses. Check on the specific course to be sure.
28 February 2024	Extra opens – applicants who have used all five choices and are not holding any offers may be able to add another choice in their application.


