By the time you have read this, all of our Early Entry students will have submitted their applications to Oxford, Cambridge and to Medical School. This is no easy feat and if you see them around the Sixth Form to congratulate them on getting the job done! (They'll also have some advice on how to make the process easier I'm sure.

As we end this term, my main message is about personal statements – remember the internal UCAS deadline is 1st November and we are just one school week away from this.

<u> Personal statements – don't delay!</u>

If you haven't completed your statement yet, please consider why. It might be that:

- 1) You aren't applying to university. If this is the case, you will still need to write a letter of application for the job/apprenticeship you're applying for. The personal statement will mirror this and so you should still write one!
- 2) You're not sure about what you want to study or where you want to apply to. If this is the case, get out on Open Days as soon as you can, watch Virtual Open Days and do the leg work on Unifrog/UCAS!
- 3) You don't know how to start. If this is the case, consider the following process:

Consider your WHY:

- What do you find interesting about English Literature maybe you're fascinated by etymology? What is it about Law that you find interesting?
- If you don't know your WHY the Unifrog Subject area has information on what you can read/watch/listen to that you can use to evidence your interest.
- Don't worry about how it sounds. Even single sentences as a list to start off with works you can worry about flow later.

Consider your WHAT:

- How do your subjects help prepare you for studying this at university? Consider the soft skills you have developed (i.e. team work, evaluation, argument, debate, analysis) that are appropriate for this field.
- You should aim to refer to each of your subjects. What skills have they given you and how will these help?
- What else have you done that helps with this? Work experience? Extra curriculars that provide you with experience or skill?

Just start writing – the first draft is always the hardest. Once this is done, it's all downhill from there! Good luck!



Is managing the amount of time spent on your Phone something you think about?

This week in the study room I have noticed how much of a distraction our mobile phones can be. I decided to find out more and look at any advice on how to combat the never ending urge to look at our phones.


In 2015, psychologist Larry Rosen and Alexandra Samuel a technology specialist wrote an article for Harvard Business Review on **'Conquering Digital Distractions'**. Rosen recommended withdrawing from technology in order to re-focus, advising that the ideal thing is to limit time spent on digital tech. He advises taking regular breaks and re-charging with exercise and avoiding on-screen activities before bedtime to get plenty of rest.

Samuel recommends the opposite. She advocates that you can use technology to manage information overload, by filtering emails, sorting information into order of importance and automating posts to social networks, in other words prioritising information to suit you.

2024 ENTRY KEY DATES

2 May 2023	UCAS' search tool displays 2024 courses.	
9 May 2023	The adviser portal opens for 2024 entry. From this date, you can set up your adviser portal ready for your students to link to your centre.	
16 May 2023	Undergraduate applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can start their applications and send them to you for references and approval.	
12 July 2023	Conservatoire applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can register, pay, and send their applications.	
5 September 2023	Completed undergraduate applications can be submitted to UCAS.	
2 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Application deadline for conservatoire music applications. Applications for dance, drama, and musical theatre courses may have a different deadline – check conservatoires' websites for information.	
16 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Deadline for applications to the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and for most courses in medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine / science. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us.	
31 January 2024 18:00 (UK time)	Equal consideration date for applications for most undergraduate courses. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us. Deadline for most conservatoire undergraduate dance, drama or musical theatre courses. Check on the specific course to be sure.	
28 February 2024	Extra opens – applicants who have used all five choices and are not holding any offers may be able to add another choice in their application.	


