Driving and leaving site



Essential Update

After half term, you will notice there will have been new fences and gates installed to increase the security on our site. This will mean some changes to the way we enter, exit and park on school grounds. Please make sure you read these updates carefully so that you are aware of the changes.

Car Parking

- As of the 30th October 2023, all Sixth Form drivers will be required to park their cars on the gravel car park near Humanities.
- Please ensure that, if you drive to school, this is where you park your car. If you are unsure where this is then please ask.

Some reminders on driving:

- Sixth Formers are still permitted to apply for a parking permit, via Mrs Pasa. Students will still need a parking permit to be allowed to park their cars on site. Please see the driving section of the Sixth Form Handbook if you have any questions about driving to school.
- The timings of the gate access will remain the same: all Sixth Form drivers must be on site **before** 8.30am. Any arrival after this time will require students to seek alternative parking off site.
- Parking in the layby outside of the front of school is not permitted. This is a space for parents to drop-off/pick-up and is used during the day by members of the public. The layby is lined and RBWM may decide to send parking wardens without prior notice.
- Year 13 students may still leave site in their cars during the day, however:
 - 1. No student should leave/enter site during school break times.
 - 2. If students know they will be leaving site during the day, we request that students consider if bringing their car onto site is necessary and if an alternative method of transport (walking/cycling/public transport) could be used.
- The speed limit on site is 5mph.

Please remember that a parking permit is given at the discretion of the school and may be removed if the guidance above is not followed.

Entering and exiting site

The new fences will mean that our site is much more secure. Changes that you need to be aware of:

- The new gates will be closed and locked from 9.10am and will remain locked until 3.10.
- All Sixth Form access and exit to the school during the school day will happen via main reception. This is quite a big change for both staff and students – please ensure that you are respectful at all times to the reception team as there will be much more traffic for these members of staff on a daily basis.
- The rules surrounding leaving the site during the day have not changed:
 - Year 13 may still leave during the day as usual when they do not have a registered session. Please leave the school via the East Corridor/ Library/ Main Reception.
 - Year 12 may not leave school during the day but can do so at break to visit
 Tesco. Again, this should be via the East Corridor/ Library/ Main Reception.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and support with these changes.

Catching the train to school



Essential Update

Lots of you catch the train to school and there have been some issues lately with strikes and delays on the trains. In order to ensure that you are not given a late DT, please ensure that you follow these steps:

- If your train is delayed, please ensure that you take a photograph of the platform board so that you can show the member of SLT at the gate / your tutor when you arrive to school.
- Where trains are late and are beyond your control you will not be given a DT.
 This is the same for when there is strike action on the lines.

The school is aware that the 08:16 train from Bourne End to Furze Platt is often late – bearing this in mind, it is your responsibility to ensure that you catch a train that will get you to school on time (just as an employer would expect you to make adjustments if you know that there are consistent travel issues!)

Students that get this train should ensure that they are getting the 07:46 train instead, which will provide you with plenty of time to get to school (even if the train is delayed!).

Students that drive to school should also be aware of traffic – planned road closures and the daily rush hour need to be taken into account when you are driving to school. Remember the gate closes at 8.30am.

The Sixth Form is open from 7.30am – plenty of time to grab a tea and be ready for the day ahead!

Attendance and Punctuality:

96% is our minimum expectation for Sixth Form attendance, although students should aim for 100%.

In context:

96% = 8 school days missed per year 90% = 19 school days missed per year A student that is 30m late each week will lose the equivalent to 19 days per year Statistically, missing just 17 days per year is likely to mean a drop for students of 1 grade across their subjects

If your child is absent or has an appointment, parents/guardians need to report this through ClassCharts.


The end of term has arrived – what a relief!

Some targets for the half-term break:






UCAS deadlines for the 2024 cycle



2024 ENTRY KEY DATES

2 May 2023	UCAS' search tool displays 2024 courses.
9 May 2023	The adviser portal opens for 2024 entry. From this date, you can set up your adviser portal ready for your students to link to your centre.
16 May 2023	Undergraduate applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can start their applications and send them to you for references and approval.
12 July 2023	Conservatoire applications open for 2024 entry. From this date, applicants can register, pay, and send their applications.
5 September 2023	Completed undergraduate applications can be submitted to UCAS.
2 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Application deadline for conservatoire music applications. Applications for dance, drama, and musical theatre courses may have a different deadline – check conservatoires' websites for information.
16 October 2023 18:00 (UK time)	Deadline for applications to the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, and for most courses in medicine, dentistry, and veterinary medicine/science. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us.
31 January 2024 18:00 (UK time)	Equal consideration date for applications for most undergraduate courses. The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us. Deadline for most conservatoire undergraduate dance, drama or musical theatre courses. Check on the specific course to be sure.
28 February 2024	Extra opens – applicants who have used all five choices and are not holding any offers may be able to add another choice in their application.
