Year 13 News




I hope you've all had productive weeks – it has been great to speak to so many of you about how you're preparing for the summer exams and being able to support you in your study methods going forward.

- ➤ Parentmail this is how information about the school will be communicated home and acts as a payment platform for trips etc.
